- 4. On average, UW System institutions receive 78% of their federal funds from their primary and secondary federal agencies.**
- 5. On average, UW System institutions receive 57% of their federal funds from their primary federal agencies.**
- 6. Federal funding available from the Department of Education has declined proportionally over the last three years.**
